**Please ensure that all items of uniform and equipment are clearly marked with the owner’s name.**

<b>Winter Uniform</b>	<p>Blue coloured Powell sweatshirt or cardigan</p> <p>Blue coloured Powell Polo shirt</p> <p>Black skirt, pinafore or trousers (not leggings or fashion trousers)</p> <p>Black socks or tights</p> <p>Plain black shoes with a low heel. Not fashion shoes, trainers, boots or strappy sandals.</p>
<b>Summer Uniform</b>	<p>Blue coloured Powell Polo shirt</p> <p>Black shorts, skirt or trousers (not leggings or fashion trousers)</p> <p>Black Socks</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Blue gingham or striped dress (white socks with summer dresses)</p> <p>Sunhat with Powell logo or plain sunhat</p>
<b>PE Kit in a named bag</b>	<p>This should be kept in a draw-string named bag. Children have PE lessons indoors throughout the year so need shorts and T-shirt in school at all times.</p> <p>Navy Powell PE T-shirt or plain navy T-shirt</p> <p>Navy blue shorts</p> <p>Plimsolls (Infants) or sports trainers (juniors – not fashion trainers or ‘hi-tops’)</p> <p>Plain navy blue or school logo tracksuit (Winter only)</p>
<b>Art Apron</b>	<p>Art apron or an old shirt</p>

Nail Varnish and Jewellery	<p>We do not allow nail varnish or jewellery, with the following exceptions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Watches, but not Smartwatches which have games/internet access.</li> <li>• One pair of small stud earrings.</li> <li>• Ideally all jewellery including earrings should be removed before PE. Where total removal of earrings is not possible <i>Retainers</i> (flat studs that retain the piercing when earrings or studs are removed) are an acceptable substitution, provided these are flat and cannot cause damage if a blow or ball hits the side of the head, the level of risk is clearly reduced so these may be worn for PE. Parents should be aware that these studs are not designed to be worn for long periods and there are associated risks with using them if they are left in for several days. Where children are unable to remove earrings they should be taped over securely front and back by the child or parent (parents to provide tape). With taped earrings children will not be allowed to take part in contact sports or sports where contact from another pupil or piece of equipment may pose a risk (such as ball games, gymnastics). This does not apply to swimming, for which earrings must be removed in case they come off and get stuck in pool filters.</li> </ul>
Hair	<p>Long hair should be tied back. Hair bands/accessories should be modest and in school colours.</p> <p>We ask that parents do not allow children to have designs or tramlines shaved into their hair during term-times and that hair gel is reserved for weekends and holidays.</p>
Outerwear	<p>In cold or wet weather, please make sure you child/ren bring a smart, warm, waterproof coat to school. We actively encourage wellies on rainy days, but please provide school shoes to change into indoors. Umbrellas are not allowed on the playground at playtimes / lunchtimes – hoods are therefore strongly advised as we only stay inside if we really have to!</p>
Toys, Sweets and Money	<p>We ask that children do not bring toys, sweets or money to school. In general, it's best if children don't bring valuables to school, but if they do (such as mobile phones for children who travel alone) please make sure they give items to the teacher or school office.</p>
Stationery	<p>Reception Class, Years 1 and 2 – we will provide all stationery needed</p> <p>Key Stage 2 – Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 – please provide the following items in a pencil case and clearly marked with the child's name.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• HB pencils</li> <li>• Black handwriting pens</li> <li>• A rubber</li> <li>• A pencil sharpener</li> <li>• A small selection of coloured pencils</li> <li>• A small pair of scissors</li> <li>• A 30cm ruler (cm/mm) – not a flexible ruler</li> <li>• A clear protractor (180 degrees)</li> <li>• A small glue stick</li> </ul>
